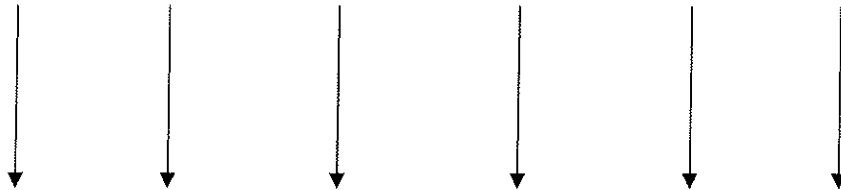


STAGE 2 - PART 8.
